We did locate a damaged power supply under the classification yards. The damage to this unit may be either the cause of or a result of the ongoing issues in the yards. Some recent examinations of the trackwork have revealed a condition or two that will have to be repaired.

HO SCALE. The mainline track replacement is continuing. If you should find areas in need of attention let us know.

Layout detail lighting and other scenery are also on the to-do list. Some of the existing buildings now have interior lights and since the lights look so good we're going to go ahead and add interiors.





A large percentage of the work that is being done is electronics, both repairs and upgrades. We were pleased with the turnout of members wanting to learn and work with the electronics but a few would not hurt.
